A participatory workshop for soil literacy and ecological awareness

- Developed by artist duo Fuzzy Earth as a public engagement project
- Combines science and art in a hands-on, multisensory workshop
- Aims to improve soil literacy and promote citizen action
- Connects urban consumers to ecological issues in food production
- Addresses overuse of synthetic fertilizers, crop monocultures, and phosphorus crisis
- Encourages composting and conscious consumer behaviour
- Highlights the role of soil in food systems and climate resilience


Workshop structure:

- <u>Soil Analysis</u> Examine local soil using scientific & sensory methods (texture, sound, taste)
- <u>Storytelling</u> Time-travel journey exploring soil formation, memory, and food connections
- <u>Soil Healing</u> Sculpt "decomposing fossils" with biochar, lime, and compost to enrich soil

- Operates across architecture, design, art, agriculture, and tech
- Focuses on multispecies entanglements and ecological storytelling
- Uses speculative design to explore new human-nonhuman relationships

- Engages communities to foster resilient and regenerative futures








